Explain how imperialism led to an increase in nationalism Since nationalists believed that their country was better than all others, they wanted to expand it. Imperialism is the practice of maintaining colonies to benefit the mother country. Nationalism is the devotion and loyalty to one's own nation. It led to imperialism because some countries like Britain, took nationalism to mean that they were the best country and race in the whole world. So by imperialistic other countries, to a certain extent, they believed that they were truly helping them, but in the end it usually ended in the other country being left worse than before they came.

Nationalists felt strong loyalty towards their country. They may have even believed that their leader had divine help to conquer all enemies. The people conquered by these nationalist colonists were often called "inferior" or "savages;" that way, leaders could justify taking their land and property. By 1900, many major countries were competing with each other for colonies. The British Empire covered Canada, India, Australia, parts of Africa and even a small part of South America. The French had parts of Africa, along with Germany. Russia also held Poland, Estonia, Ukraine, Finland, Georgia and parts of Asia.

Since the rulers of each country thought they deserved to rule the whole world, military spending increased. The countries also made military alliances with each other. The competition for colonies with some countries and alliances with others contributed to the start of World War I in 1914. Russia's annexation of the Crimea is a more recent example of nationalism and imperialism. However, most countries today are not imperialistic. People

still feel nationalism and pride In their country, but they want economic success Instead of expansion.
