Summary of journey to the west: the monkey king's amazing adventures

One of the greatest Chinese epics ever written in the History of Chinese Literature is the epic of Wu Chengen entitled "Journey to the West: The Monkey Kings Amazing Adventures." The founder of the People's Republic of China, Mao Zedong, actually used the story of the Monkey King to forward his policies on changing society and rebelling against the elite in society, citing the experience of Monkey King "rebelling against the celestial heavens and defeating 100, 000 celestial warriors" (Cheng'en, Richard and Kane 5-226).
