Identify and briefly describe the two characteristics of modified extended families. Evaluate the view that the extended family is of little importance in modern industrial societies. Define the term patriarchy in relation to the family. Identify and briefly describe two ways in which patriarchy within the family may be expressed. “ Patriarchal family structures are no longer to be found in modern industrial societies. ” Evaluate this claim. Define the term cultural deprivation. Identify and briefly describe two ways in which cultural deprivation impacts on educational achievements.

Evaluate the view that class is the most significant factor in determining educational achievements in modern industrial societies. Define the term labelling. Identify and briefly describe two sociological examples that illustrate the process of labelling in relation to education. “ Ethnicity has relatively little impact on educational attainment in modern industrial societies. Evaluate the view that the growth of new religious movements is evidence that religion continues to play a major role in modern industrial societies.
