According to HAERENS, a filibuster is a legislator giving lengthy speeches in order to slow legislation or obstruct by delaying it. To institute a filibuster two-thirds majority of senate is required as a proof at least 16 senators have to sign a petition for any given closure (Wawro and Schickler 14).
