The first major I'm interested in is Chemistry. This requires 30 credits. With Chemistry, you pick a course curriculum in your major and then pick special topics courses and selections from other areas of chemistry that go with it. Chemistry can be helpful because in cosmetology you are working with chemicals sometimes. You would want to know what chemicals work together and which don't so you don't end up with an accident. For example, if you mixed a perm or hair dye wrong and the clients hair fell out, you could lose your job or certification.

Again, you have to maintain a C or higher to earn your credits.
