"Josephine is so inspired with music and dancing that she would die for it. While she was working, she met a man name Willie Baker, whom she married for a short period of time. She never depend on a man for financial support and she never hesitated to leave the relationships.

Josephine Baker spent her youth in poverty before learning to dance and finding success on Broadway. Second, Josephine Baker career started at an early age in Paris. She started out as a preteen street performer in SST. Louis, Missouri and toured the country with the Jones Family Band and the Dixie Steppers. She tried to become a chorus girl for the Dixie Steppers production, "Shuffle Along". She was turned down because she was too skinny and too dark. She was still determined to learn the role of a chorus girl, she then got place in the production.

She was the comedic act of the show that made err popular with the audiences. With the obsession of France, she traveled to Paris to perform in La Revue Negro at the theater where she admires cultural figures and earning nicknames like "Black Pearl" and "Black Venus". Her career thrived in Paris Society when she perform," Dense Savage". Josephine knew how to manipulate racial stereotypes to near advantage when seen appeared naked except Tort a tiny skull made of bananas, playing the role of the primal, and cleverly handles with white people's ideas about race and sexuality, "I wasn't really naked.

I simply didn't have NY clothes on. " Josephine was elegant and self-aware and like nothing anyone had ever seen. Furthermore, Josephine style of dancing is what makes it unique, new, and exotic.
