As per the 2011 census, India has about 2.7 million people with disabilities, and only a handful of those enjoy education and/or employment. We are spending less than 4% of our GDP on important areas of education and health. Almost 12% of our children (between 5 and 15 years) are identified as child labor, and we have about 2.4 million people living with wealth. Almost 25% of my Indians are poor - in the same India where millions use smartness.

Within India, there are many different countries. There is no doubt that in some areas we are a developed country and, as far as people with disability are concerned, we have created facilities and a support system. But in many areas we still have a long way to go. Now I leave it to you to decide whether you perceive India as developing or not! We have to focus on the "safety of women" and "corruption". Corruption has mired growth to a great extent, and past and present governments have so far been unsuccessful in finding a permanent solution.

The young Indian faces challenges stretching from a poorly administered education system to the lowest average wage rates in the world.
