Homer-Dixson suggests that society needs to prepare for the impact which these events could bring. He also mentions that theorganizations should be prepared for overall changes. Especially, Homer-Dixson stresses that the organizations have to be ready to adapt to the structural stress that will occur. He also presents that this structural stresscan have a significant impact on the organizations and that top management has a responsibility to handle it. Regarding profit maximization, Homer-Dixon agrees with Friedman, and he says that "his approach is not suitable for private companies that seek profit alone".
