Main Characters of Homer's Iliad Zeus, Agamemnon, Achilles, Apollo, and Hector
Hesiod claimed to write his poems through divine inspiration
The gods, in Homer's poem care about the honor given them by men
The term "philosophy" means the love of wisdom
Homer's great poem, The Iliad, begins by announcing that its theme will be
Rage and Justice, in the Homeric world, consists in giving to each man his due
Hubris: Arrogance or excessive self-confidence
Hesiod: Author of Theogony
Homer: Reputed author of the Iliad and The Odyssey
The Iliad tells of the war that the Greeks fought against Troy, and of the Odyssey, the tale of the adventures of Odysseus (Ulysses) making his wandering way home from Troy to Ithaca. (Homer)
Theogony: The ancient Greek story of the origin of all things, including the gods. (Hesiod)
