When I was young I had a very bad temper and my relatives thought that I should be "put away." I studied at schools for the deaf in Boston and New York City. During my junior year of Radcliffe, I produced my first book.

I graduated cum laude from Radcliffe College in 1904. I never got married or had kids. I wrote many best-selling books including "Light in my darkness." I was also a leading member of the American Foundation for the blind. I also

got many awards and one of those was the presidential medal of freedom in 1964. I had many obstacles that I had to overcome for intense, I was deaf-blind and couldn't communicate like everyone else. I had to learn that I would have to communicate in different ways with people.

I, Helen Keller am apart of this society due to the fact that I helped change blind and deaf people lives. Here are some interesting facts about me, I was the first deaf-blind person to get a bachelors of arts degree.
