During the Year of Spaghetti, you are greeted with a man that does everything after spaghetti. It is the most important thing in his life, so he compares it to a German Shepherd. " Big enough to bathe a German Shepherd in"(1). " I'd gather up the trampled-down shadows of time, knead them into the shape of a German Shepherd, toss them into rolling water, and sprinkle them with salt"(4).
