Document 4 suggests that " Jefferson slaves were his property'. Both Dotcom . NET 4 and 5 talk about Jefferson grant of freedom to seven slaves. It talks about a s lave which he had an affair with, and her children, who were all given freedom. He only granted freedom to very few slaves, which proves he did not live up to his bell ifs.

The Louisiana purchase was directed by a loose construction of the constitution, c monetary to Jefferson beliefs. It says in Document 6, "

Nowhere in the constitution could J offers find mention of the purchase of land from foreign powers. " Presidents do not have this right to purchase such lands, yet Jefferson thought it wasn't beyond his rights given in the constitution.
