The paper "Cyberpunk in Winter Market by Gibson" is a great example of a literature assignment. There is no denying the fact that the contemporary Cyberpunk emanating from the West is innately imbued with what Csicsery-Ronay refers to as "the sense of a collapsed future (Csicsery-Ronay 4)". There is a sense of dejection and categorical defeat in the face of the emerging threats arising from the old colonies to which the West doled out its quasi-authentic ideas of democracy and technological egalitarianism. In that context, Gibson's Winter Market does evince the initiation of this ideological and technological vegetation as he explores the themes of extreme technological advancement tagged to the sense of human decay and perfidy. Under the guise of technological proliferation and the adjoining sense of purification, Gibson in Winter Market does deal with the loss of humanity and as to what does it means to be a human.

Death of Ideology

The amazing thing about the contemporary Cyberpunk emanating from the West is that nowhere it intends to affiliate to any ideological stance or position. Rather it moves ahead with the congregation of a technological induced world where one witness the "replacement of national sovereignty and class consciousness by technically sophisticated, but ethically savage (Csicsery-Ronay 4)" vested interests and groups. In Gibson's Winter Market, one comes across this annihilation of the tender human sentiments as Casey confesses, "Because she was dead, and I'd let her go. Because, now she was immortal, and I'd help her get that way (Gibson 1)." It unravels a state of existence where the sense of technological sophistication fails to recompense for human angst and aspirations
