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Framework Analysis Framework Analysis The framework of the article is related to application of more than one discipline. The disciplines involved in the analysis of the therapeutic relationship include psychotherapy, counseling and psychology. Therefore, there is no single theory that can be applied in the investigation of the phenomena at hand. In this regard, conceptual framework was considered ideal for the study. Analytically, the framework does not qualify to be a theoretical framework because a theoretical framework involves a framework that envisages the relationships that exists between variables. Besides, just like Smart & Paulsen (2011) stipulates, a theoretical framework is actually based on only one theory. When the analysis of therapeutic relationship is at stake, there must be more than two theories especially from psychology and psychoanalysis in order to offer a broad explanation of the variables.
